- (i) the propensity of any equine to behave in ways that may result in injury, harm or death to persons on or around them and/or damage to property in their vicinity;
- (ii) the unpredictability of an equine’s reaction to such things as sounds, sudden movements and unfamiliar objects, persons or other animals;
- (iii) the equine’s response to certain hazards such as surface and subsurface objects;
- (iv) collisions with other equines, animals, people and objects;
- (v) the potential of a participant to act in a negligent manner that may contribute to injury to the participant or other, such as failing to maintain control over the equine or to act within his or her ability.

Neither SUNWEST EQUINE SERVICES or the YOUTH EMERGENCY SHELTER SOCIETY or it’s owners, the organizing committee of the show, officials, volunteers, staff, or agents shall in any way be liable for any accident, injury, damage, loss or for any other matter that may happen to exhibitors, competitors, owners, agents or to anyone on the grounds or to any animal or article brought to the grounds. It is to be understood and agreed that by making any entry in the Y.E.S.S. ENTRY FEE IS \$50.00 FOR THE DAY FOR HORSE AND RIDER COMINATION OR \$10.00 PER CLASS.

ADDITIONAL RIDER OR HORSE IS \$15.00. (i.e. one horse with two riders or one rider with two horses)

Horses will be judged on manners, attitude and way of going according to their breed and discipline.

In the event of a dispute, the decision of the show committee will be final.

DIRECTIONS - From Hwy 33, go east at the Rich Valley School onto Twp. Rd. 564 for 5 miles to Range Road 23. Go south for 1.5 miles to **56217 R.R. 23** (east side of R.R. 23)

From Hwy 16, go north on Hwy 43 past Onoway turnoff to Hwy 37. Go east on Hwy 37 two miles to Hwy 777. Go north on Hwy 777 for 8 miles (last two miles are dirt) to Twp. Rd. 562. Go west on Twp. Rd. 562 two miles to R.R. 23. Go north on R.R. 23 for ½ mile. Second driveway on the east side at **56217 R.R. 23**

DESCRIPTION OF EVENTS

TACK – Any legal bit on any aged horse. Two hands are permitted with leverage bits, martingales and other training equipment also permitted

DRESS – Show clothes are not required. Helmets are required for those under 18 and encouraged for those over 18. Footwear must have a minimum 5/8" heel.

AGE OF RIDER as of January 1, 2008

SHOWMANSHIP CLASSES – Patterns will be posted.

PLEASURE CLASSES – English or Western, each entry will be judged according to riding style and breed standard.

REINING WALK TROT – Modified pattern will be posted. Entrants may have someone coaching them from inside or outside the ring.

TOILER PAPER PAIRS – Pairs will be required to follow the judge's instructions while holding on to the ends of a length of toilet paper. You will be eliminated if your toilet paper breaks. If you do not have a partner but would like to enter this class, please indicate on the entry form by writing the class number and circling it, and we will attempt to find a partner for you.

WATER RACE – Teams of 4 will be required to fill a container with water using a cup. The winning team will have the most water in the container. Help will be given to those who have trouble connecting with the water bucket. Teams will be selected at the beginning of the class.

CALCUTTA AUCTION AND HORSE AND HOUND EVENT

The agility dogs will perform individual demonstrations. After each dog performs it will be teamed with a horse and rider and then auctioned to the highest bidder. All money raised in this auction will be put into a pot. Half of the money will be awarded to the buyer of the winning team in the horse and hound event. The remainder will be donated to the Youth Emergency Shelter. Each team will compete individually. First, the horse and rider will complete a simple trail course. When the horse crosses the finish line, the canine team member will then complete their obstacle course. The winner will be the team with the fastest time and the least faults.

MUSICAL STALLS – Similar to musical chairs, stalls will consist of poles laid on the ground.

OPPOSITE PAIRS – What ever makes you opposite from your partner. English – Western, large horse – small horse, male – female, anything goes. Costumes are permitted.

EQUITATION – English or Western, will be judged according to the style of riding and the breed standard.

REINING – All ages, pattern will be posted. Simple lead changes permitted.

ON COMMAND – All ages. Instruction will be given before the class starts.
